SPECIAL GRANT PROFILE: WESTERN NEW YORK KIDNEY FOUNDATION

Ticket Sales Impacting our Community

One of the ways that the Maria Love Convalescent Fund fulfills its mission is by awarding Special Grants each year. These grants, which range from \$1,000 to \$10,000, are used toward programming or operational costs of non-profit organizations that benefit Erie County residents. Two of the most recent examples of how your Charity Ball tickets have impacted our community are the grants given to both the WNY Kidney Foundation and The Buffalo Therapeutic Riding Center (BTRC).

The Kidney Foundation of Western New York, has been supporting our community since 2015. The foundation provides community awareness, prevention education and health services for patients and families affected by kidney disease, related illnesses and disabilities.

This October we were delighted to welcome Barbara Breckinridge, Director of Patient Services and Community Outreach, and Jeremy Morlock, Foundations Manager, who both presented to our Board. Barbara is a twenty-year kidney recipient herself and has continued to be an advocate for kidney health while counseling dialysis/transplant patients and families through treatment. Barbara also coordinates an extremely effective outreach group through ECMC. Jeremy's roll with the foundation includes overseeing efforts in community presence and volunteer services.

The Kidney Foundation facilitates access to the wide-ranging resources required to meet patient needs; including everything from aiding and understanding the disease, laying out treatment options, and educating patients and family members through support groups and peer to peer counseling. Every individual's needs are

different ranging from financial assistance, transportation, nutritional supplements for kidney health, emergency medical identification jewelry and family counseling.

Social workers coordinate closely with the patients undergoing dialysis care while they are on the transplant list. Typically, visits to the dialysis center are three times a week for three to five hours of treatments. Patients will continue to receive health support after the kidney transplant, which includes recovery and adjustment to life-long medications and nutritional needs. One in seven people will be affected by kidney disease, with 220 individuals currently waiting in the Buffalo area alone. Over 2,000 people throughout an eight-county area of Western New York are on the kidney transplant list.



SPECIAL GRANT PROFILE: THE BUFFALO THERAPEUTIC RIDING CENTER

The Buffalo Therapeutic Riding Center (BTRC), located in North Buffalo in a former indoor polo facility, serves children between the ages of six and 18 who are mentally and/or emotionally impaired, learning disabled, developmentally challenged, or who have other medical conditions. Regardless of whether a child has autism, cancer, or emotional disturbances, research shows that their time spent interacting with horses offers physical, psychological, social, and educational benefits. Or as the BTRC says, "There is a unique bond between horses and people that can be particularly meaningful to children with disabilities."

The BTRC is the only therapeutic riding program in Western New York accredited by the Professional Association of Therapeutic Horsemanship International (PATH). The horses in the program, which runs every Monday from April to November,

are donated from around the country for this purpose. Trained volunteers are vital to the program and do everything from tacking horses to leading riders. Classes are limited to no more than four students with anywhere from one to three volunteers per student. The program served 175 students this year, and, as Susan Schoellkopf,



Executive Director of Buffalo Therapeutic Riding Center, shared during her presentation to the Maria Love November Board Meeting, "this is one of the gems of Buffalo."

Reflecting similar sentiments, a parent testimonial reads: "Each week, I find myself holding back tears of joy when I watch her. I've never seen her look so proud...We know life is tough for her, and this gives her an opportunity to forget. We only wish we found this program sooner."

The Fund's grant provided scholarships for participants unable to cover the full cost of lessons. The Maria Love Convalescent Fund Board of Directors was pleased to have been able to help local children benefit from this wonderful program.
